I just recently finished a book, "God's Dream for You" by Matthew Barnett, pastor and leader of the Dream Center in California, and he had some poignant thoughts and I want to share them with you. He begins, "Human need is often God's call to action."

At Grace Mission we uncover opportunities to serve by placing ourselves in a position to let our hearts be broken. We will be taking fifteen children to **Summer Camp at Camp Weed July 3 – 6** where they will bask in the love of Jesus through their counselors and enjoy all the activities they have been dreaming of for months. Also, if you'd like to help support sending a child to camp, gently used pool and bath towels, new pillows, pillowcases, bug spray, sunscreen, or gift cards to Wal-Mart for clothes, shoes and supplies are most welcome. To send a child to camp costs an average of \$200 per child so any donations are appreciated.
