



# **LENT 2020**

Dear Ministry Partners,

**Thank you to everyone who contributed to Grace Mission throughout 2019.** We could not continue all the wonderful work and ministry we do at Grace Mission without our volunteers, sponsors and donors.

Last year, The 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Evening of Grace, **Benefit on the Bayou**, fundraising event at the Woman's Club of Tallahassee was a huge success due to the hard work of many volunteers. Thank you to everyone that organized the event, volunteered, attended, donated and danced the night away with us. I also want to say a special thank you (for another successful event) to everyone that volunteered and attended the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual **Blues & BBQ** fundraising event in August. We also raised money through **GoFundMe** for a new on-demand hot water tank and a new ADA-compliant shower room. All of us at Grace Mission are very grateful for your generous support.

Your contributions this winter season helped us giveaway many coats, blankets, sweaters, sweatshirts along with numerous sweatpants, pants, winter caps and scarves, hygiene products and much more. Throughout the year we had 4 **free** <u>Health Clinics</u> (we are partners with FSU Medical School and Leon County Health Dept.) and we were able to give 40 **free** flu shots this year, as well as 40 **free** Hepatitis A shots. We continue to provide <u>free showers</u> three times per week, as well as <u>free laundry services</u> (1 load of laundry per person). We gave away an approximate total value of \$29,050.00 worth of clothing items and a total of \$6,260.00 (\$10.00 each) Goodwill vouchers to those in need through our once a month free <u>clothing giveaway</u>. Thank you for your donations and please continue to clean out your closets and donate to Grace Mission.

Grace Mission, through our partnership with Second Harvest, offered **free quarterly** <u>Mobile Food Pantries</u> giving away wholesome and nutritious food to over 1529 people in Leon County. Many people volunteer to make this event successful and we are grateful for your support!

"The truth about it is, whether we is rich or poor or something in between, this earth ain't no final restin' place. So in a way, we is all homeless – just workin' our way toward home." <u>same kind of different as me</u> by Ron Hall & Denver Moore Grace Mission continued to support the Brehon House (for pregnant women who need shelter and help during pregnancy). We delivered baby clothing and other baby items that they needed. Grace Mission supports the local humane society by providing towels for the many homeless animals at the shelter. We have provided clothing, hygiene items and food to other agencies in the Big Bend area.

We continue to raise money, through our outreach basket each Sunday, for many partner agencies that help people suffering from poverty and homelessness in Leon County.

We served 38,000 hot nutritious meals in 2019.

As a worshipping community within the Episcopal Church we continue to provide a Eucharist celebration every Sunday, Morning Prayer on Wednesday, Evening Prayer on Thursday and we baptized 7 adults. Bible study remains strong and vibrant. People are learning Scripture and it's very exciting to see that! We are seeing larger numbers attend the 12 Step Recovery Service on Tuesday nights.

The <u>Christmas Angel Trees</u> at each church provided over 300 Christmas gifts for children attending our After-School Program and their siblings. St. John's Episcopal Church partnered with us to provide a beautiful venue and atmosphere for our Family Christmas Service. We served dinner to the families, provided entertainment and handed out the gifts for the children. It was a lovely evening. We had 8 children earn the right to go to <u>Camp Weed</u> (did you know we outfit each child with new clothes and shoes for the entire 5 days of camp) to enjoy a wonderful Christian Education program along with all the fun camp activities. <u>The Reading Academy</u> helped our After-School children prepare for the new school year by improving their reading ability. This past year's theme was 'Friends of the Earth' and it ended with a field trip to Wakulla Springs. The program reminded all the children of the importance of protecting the environment and being good stewards of this incredible planet. This year the theme is 'Sea TurtleTastic.'

The beginning of each school year we give out **new** backpacks (<u>Blessing of the Backpacks</u>) to the S.O.A.R. After-School children. Each Backpack is filled with all the school supplies that they may need to help them succeed in school. Thank you to all the people who donated back packs and school supplies especially Holy Comforter Episcopal Church. We are humbled by your support. We also shared additional school supplies with Riley Elementary School and Griffin Middle School. The Grace Mission <u>S.O.A.R. After School</u> program continues to help and encourage the children enrolled in the program to academically succeed in school.

Grace Mission is committed to raising money to support our budget and ministry needs. We raised 36% of our income this year through our Fundraisers, Mail-outs, 100 & 500 Club, and Alternative Markets. This of course is a reflection of the dedication and commitment of all the volunteers, sponsors and donors who support Grace Mission. **Thank you!** We also want to thank the many churches that support us each month in their outreach budgets.

Thank you for giving of your time, talent and treasure in helping to bring help, healing and hope to the City of Tallahassee.

Grades and efforts at school are improving with an average of a one-letter grade increase in some cases.





Grace Missions week long intensive summer <u>Reading Academy</u> titled, <u>'Friends of the Earth'</u> shared lessons on climate control, global warming, carbon emissions, sustainability, recycling, pollution, and how God calls us to be good stewards of the Earth. They received so many hugs goodbye from new friends and counselors, you could just feel the energy and support that they had experienced all week long.
